



## Annual Report on Completion/Graduation Rates for Student-Athletes

The following information is provided in compliance with the Student Right-to-Know Act of 1990 and includes a full report on all students and students receiving athletically related financial aid. Each fall cohort includes first-time, full-time certificate- and degree-seeking students enrolled as of census date (end of the fourth week of the fall term). The graduation rates are based on 150 percent of time to certificate or degree. The transfer-out rates are based on data from the National Student Clearinghouse indicating students' enrollment at an institution after enrollment at Gaston College within the same 150%-time frame. Categories are mutually exclusive; that is, if a student graduated and then transferred, they are only counted as a graduate.
