A-321 Advanced Manufacturing Camp: Fun, hands-on lab sessions in computer aided-design, machining, and robotics will introduce you to the skills you can acquire through an apprenticeship or a career in advanced manufacturing. You will also tour local manufacturing facilities to see first-hand how these job skills are used in today’s manufacturing industry!

You will need a minimum 12-megapixel camera (DSLR) that has the ability to change ISO, aperture, and shutter speed, plus a cord or a card reader to connect the camera to a computer.
