



CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA) I & II

Duties: Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) work as part of a healthcare team under the supervision of licensed practical or licensed vocational nurses and registered nurses. CNA's provide basic care and help with activities of daily living. They typically do the following:

- Clean and bathe patients
- Help patients use the toilet and dress
- Turn, reposition, and transfer patients between beds and wheelchairs
- Listen to and record patients' health concerns and report that information to nurses
- Measure patients' vital signs, such as blood pressure and temperature
- Serve meals and help patients eat

CNA's are often the principal caregivers in nursing and residential care facilities. CNA's often develop relationships with their patients because some patients stay in these facilities for months or years.

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students should be able to demonstrate skills necessary to qualify as a Nursing Assistant I with the North Carolina Nurse Aide I Registry.

Certified Nursing Assistant II course is designed to prepare students to perform more complex skills for patients or residents regardless of the setting. Upon satisfactory completion of the course and skill/competency evaluation, the graduate is eligible to apply for listing as a Nurse Aide II by the North Carolina Board of Nursing Nurse Aide Registry. In all employment settings, the listed Nursing Assistant II will work under the direction and supervision of licensed personnel.
