Global Experience: Complete a minimum of 30 pre-approved hours of intercultural contact – a copy of your journal and/or reflection paper(s) must be placed in your ePortfolio* as official documentation.

- Study Abroad includes travel abroad either individually or with an organized group.
- Domestic Intercultural Experience includes intercultural contact on a local level (internships, organizing and/or attending events, volunteering, mentoring, community service, etc.)
- Virtual Study Abroad Study Abroad Association 360 GLE (30-hour) Cultural Studies Course

International Activities and Dialogue: Participate in a minimum of eight approved events and write a reflection essay about each event. It is recommended you complete at least two events per semester. Before submitting your reflection essay's final revision(s), it is suggested that you meet with a Writing Coach in the Gaston College Writing Center so that you submit your best efforts in your ePortfolio for review. Your reflection essay should be completed within three weeks of the event and placed in your ePortfolio as official documentation.

- Passport Events other pre-approved, on-campus activities with a global component such as MAC events.

*As you work on this program, you will build an ePortfolio that documents all required components for the Gaston College Scholars of Global Distinction program certification, which must be completed during your time as a student at Gaston College. You will submit your multi-media ePortfolio at least one month **prior to your graduation date**. Your official Gaston College transcript will reflect the designation of Gaston College Scholar of Global Distinction once your ePortfolio has received final approval from the Global Education Program team.

Gaston College will recognize the completion of this program in the "regalia" section of the graduation program. Both Gaston College and UNC Chapel Hill will give certificates to Scholars following the completion of this program.
