Japan, one of the world's most literate and technically advanced nations, is an East Asian archipelago country made up of four primary islands and more than 6,800 others. While most of Japan is covered by mountains and heavily wooded areas, the country's people lead a distinctly urban lifestyle. Long culturally influenced by its neighbors, today the country blends its ancient traditions with aspects of Western life.

## DAY 2 - TOKYO - October 15

Arrive in Tokyo, Japan Airport Transfer Hotel Check-in, Refresh & Relax

Orientation Walking Tour - The group will become oriented with their neighborhood, the public transportation systems, nearby pharmacies, markets, ATMs, etc. Additionally, an in-depth safety briefing will be provided for what to do incase of an emergency.

## DAY 3 - TOKYO - October 16

Palace East Gardens - Explore the beautiful gardens, Nijubashi Bridge, and Fujimi-yagura Watchtower

Tokyo National Museum @ Ueno Park - Visit Japan's oldest museum showcasing art, ancient artifacts, and samurai armor.

Senso-ji Shrine - A brief tour of Tokyo's oldest temple, including Kaminarimon Gate and the temple complex, followed by Free Time at Nakamise Street explore the vibrant pedestrian street filled with shops offering traditional Japanese snacks and souvenirs.

**Tokyo Skytree -** Visit the tallest structure in Japan for panoramic city views and explore Skytree Town for shopping and dining.
